About the service

Lindisfarne Care Home provides accommodation and nursing and personal care for up to 63 people. At the time of inspection, there were 55 people living at the home.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- All visitors had a temperature check and completed a health declaration before entry. There was ample PPE and handwashing facilities available.
- The home was clean, and staff were regularly cleaning frequently touched surfaces.
- Staff had received guidance on correct PPE use and were following this.
- The provider recognised the contribution staff made throughout the pandemic by increasing pay rates and paying staff when they needed to isolate.
- •The manager used 'zoning', creating separate areas of the home with dedicated staff and facilities, to minimise the risk of the spread of infections.
- The provider had created a screened indoor visiting area for relatives to visit their loved ones.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to the coronavirus pandemic we are looking at the preparedness of care homes in relation to infection prevention and control. This was a targeted inspection looking at the infection control and prevention measures the provider has in place.
