Summary of findings

Overall summary

Hollymede Cottage residential home provides accommodation and personal care for up to 14 people across two floors. At the time of our inspection 14 people were living at the service, some of whom were living with dementia.

We found the following examples of good practice during our inspection.

The process for visiting service users was up to date with the most recent guidelines. Processes for healthcare professionals visiting is also in guidance and has been shared with them.

The home provided several social media platforms to help people stay in touch with their friends and families.

There was a robust visitor management procedure in place to ensure people were kept safe. Comprehensive risk assessments had been completed for all staff to help mitigate the risk of COVID 19 infection.

People's well-being was looked after by staff who knew them well. Staff had increased activites and social engagements within the home.

We were assured that this service met good infection prevention and control guidelines.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to the COVID-19 pandemic we are looking at the preparedness of care homes in relation to infection prevention and control. This was a targeted inspection looking at the infection control and prevention measures the provider has in place.
