## Summary of findings

#### Overall summary

Craven Nursing Home Limited is a nursing home providing nursing and personal care for up to 68 people. The home is split into three separate units called Heron, Swan and Millard. The Heron unit specialises in supporting people living with Dementia. At the time of the inspection there was 48 people living in the service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

The systems in place allowed people to be admitted to the home safely. Each unit was separated to prevent cross infection. There was no movement of residents between units and staff movement was kept to a minimum.

There was clear signage on the correct use of PPE and handwashing techniques and staff had received appropriate infection control and prevention training.

A detailed risk assessment was in place for ensuring safe visits, this included a booking system, to allow for social distancing, visitor agreement form, health screening and use of PPE.

Local restrictions on visiting were in place at the time of the inspection and alternative measures such as video calls were being used. The home had also purchased a purpose built outside visiting pod to allow safe visits when national restrictions allowed.

The home sent regular updates to family members to update them on current visiting restrictions in the home with assurances about how they were managing.

The environment was very clean. Additional cleaning was taking place including of frequently touched surfaces.

#### Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 02 December 2020 and was announced.

We have also signposted the provider to resources to develop their approach.

- •We recommended Covid specific care plans were reviewed for people using the service to ensure they are up to date and robust.
- •We recommended that the home carry out additional checks to ensure PPE was available, stored appropriately and worn correctly by staff.
